MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

As the inaugural strategic plan of my tenure draws to a close, the Football Federation of Belize is poised to unveil a fresh strategic trajectory for the upcoming year. The federation has ample cause for celebration as its commendable achievements have attested to its resilience and unyielding determination in realizing shared objectives.

Despite the obstacles imposed by the pandemic, the federation refused to yield and promptly resumed football activities across Belize. Competitions were conducted throughout the country for both male and female players, underscoring the federation's unwavering commitment to the beautiful game. The recommencement of the Premiere League of Belize and the National Amateur Women's League were salient milestones in Belizean football. Moreover, the federation accorded priority to capacity building for coaches, referees, and officials at all levels. It allocated the requisite resources to furnish training programs nationwide and to recruit new referees and officials to fortify the football fraternity.

The year 2022 bore witness to several unprecedented events for football in Belize, including the remarkable qualification of Verdes Football Club to the second round of the CONCACAF League and the inauguration of the Football for School initiative. A tripartite collaboration involving the FFB, Ministry of Sport, and Belize Tourism Board saw the construction of the first artificial turf in Belize City was also a momentous feat.

The introduction of the first student-athlete program was another landmark event, enabling the federation to enlist a professional agency firm to identify and provide football scholarship opportunities to aspiring football athletes. The federation successfully dispatched 22 athletes to pursue tertiary education in the United States while concurrently engaging in a professional football program to enhance their abilities - an investment that will eventually accrue benefits for the national team programs.

The apex of 2022 was the visit of FIFA President Gianni Infantino, who was accompanied by a retinue of football greats and legends. The Belizean Football Family warmly embraced the President and accorded him an unforgettable experience. He commended the federation for its accomplishments and judicious use of the funds and resources bestowed by FIFA.

With the finalization of the bleacher rehabilitation project and the formulation of a comprehensive design and master plan for the FFB Headquarters, the federation continues to expend resources on enhancing its headquarters and training facilities. The federation is appreciative of the diligence and commitment exhibited by its secretariat and district offices.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation to the extended football family for their vital role in the metamorphosis of football in our nation. The federation pledges that the labor and sacrifices made will result in boundless and indelible rewards for football in Belize in the near future.



MESSAGE FROM THE GENERAL SECRETARY

At the beginning of the year 2022 there was renewed zeal, despite the challenges of the previous years with the pandemic, to get football playing in all areas of our country and to compete on the international stage. This enthusiasm was met by the Competitions Department to get the amateurs' competition started as early as January 2022 in the southern district of our country and by March the entire country was in full swing playing football again. We took full advantage of the urgent need of addressing the sporting vacuum that the pandemic had created and used it to our advantage for the betterment of football players. Not only were we active on the local scene but on the international scene as well. Our National Teams male and female; boys and girls also traveled around Central America competing in UNCAF and CONCACAF Tournaments, and by the close of 2022, we have demonstrated our unifying power to bring our people of different ethnic, religious and social backgrounds together and provide more opportunities for both locally and internationally for our players. It is our signature achievement that over twenty players were given scholarships to study and train at educational institutions in the United States of America. Even, our government Ministry of Education came onboard in assisting our football players with financial assistance for school expenses.

The FIFA Football for Schools projects launched in August with the collaboration of the Ministry of Education is a testament to our belief that football can create a lasting legacy for our children in this country and it has the ability to support social change in the development of our young people. Immediately after the launch of the project, we were embraced by a visit of FIFA President Infantino who reiterated FIFA's continuous support for the Football Federation of Belize. This visit served to strengthen our relationship locally and internationally.

The year 2022 has seen the completion of our bleacher's rehabilitation project and the purchase of some 27 acres of land from Reconddev, this has tremendously increased our asset base and at the same time cleared the way to move forward with the project for a comprehensive design of the complete layout of the property by VIVIDARCH architectural firm. FFB, under the guidance of President Chuc and his Executive members, was able to make all these achievements through good governance and strict financial control of the funds entrusted to us under the FIFA Forward Development Programme. It must be mentioned that once again, for the fourth year in a row, our auditor has given an "Unqualified" Audit report which reflects proper management of the funds.

The successes we have seen in 2022 has been a product of much hard work by our FFB dedicated team. However, many challenges lie ahead so we cannot sit idly, but must seize the time and work even harder with the guidance of our Creator in advancing football in our country.

DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

In the year 2022, a remarkable achievement was witnessed with the completion of the FFB Stadium's bleachers rehabilitation project. The extensive renovation of the bleachers has resulted in an impressive seating capacity of 3500, which provides an exciting and comfortable viewing experience for spectators.

Moreover, the refurbished bleachers have been designed with the utmost attention to convenience and accessibility, ensuring that all members of the community, regardless of their physical abilities, can enjoy the spectacle of the game. To this end, concession rooms, as well as male and female bathrooms, have been integrated into the structure, adding to the overall comfort and convenience of visitors.

The completion of this project is a testament to the dedication and commitment of all stakeholders involved in the process. It stands as a shining example of what can be achieved through hard work, determination, and a commitment to delivering excellence. The FFB Stadium's bleachers rehabilitation project has set a new standard for sports infrastructure and provides a solid foundation for future developments in this field.

In 2022, the Football Federation of Belize (FFB) achieved another milestone in its efforts to develop football infrastructure in the country. The FFB signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Ministry of Sports and the Ministry of Tourism in a tri-partied agreement to undertake the construction and rehabilitation of the Berger community football facility in Belize City.

Through this partnership, the FFB has overseen the construction of the first-ever synthetic football pitch in Belize City. This state-of-the-art facility is specifically designed to cater to the needs of youth programs and tournaments organized by the FFB. The synthetic pitch offers a host of advantages over traditional grass pitches, including enhanced durability, improved safety, and reduced maintenance costs.

This project stands as a testament to the FFB's unwavering commitment to the development of football at the grassroots level. By providing young footballers with access to top-quality infrastructure, the FFB is creating a pathway for the development of future generations of football talent in Belize.

The partnership between the FFB and the Ministry of Sports and the Ministry of Tourism underscores the importance of collaboration in driving sustainable development in sports. It represents a significant step forward in Belize's efforts to establish itself as a hub for football development in the region.



A SYNTHETIC TURF FOR SAN IGNACIO

On 26 April 2019 an MOU was signed between the Football Federation of Belize and the Santa Elena & San Ignacio Town Council to build a five-a-side football pitch in the Santa Elena area of the twin city. The purpose of the pitch was to create opportunities for players, coaches, referees, and volunteers to undergo training to improve their skills/knowledge of football in an effort to increase the care of skilled and trained personnel to develop the sport of football. FFB invested \$115,903.42 with the understanding that FFB would have 20 years of priority use of the pitch and share the expenses for the lighting of the pitch. On 8 January 2022, the pitch known as Falcon Field was formally inaugurated with a match played between the San Ignacio & Santa Elena Town Council and the FFB Secretariat Staff.

The Football Federation of Belize (FFB) conducted the Concacaf C Licensee course, which aimed to enhance the coaching skills of aspiring coaches in Belize. Facilitated by the FFB Technical Director Philip Marin, Head of Coaching Education Johnathan Hooper, Coach Marvin Ottley, and Coach Dale Pelayo, the course was supervised by CONCACAF mentor Neal Ellis from the USA. The course was divided into three modules, and a total of 27 coaches from various parts of Belize participated in module 1, which took place earlier in the year. In May, module 2 was carried out with 20 coaches, and module three concluded in December with 15 coaches. The course provided an opportunity for the development of coaches' competencies to coach at the youth, amateur, and the highest level in Belize, ensuring that Belizean football continues to grow and flourish in the future.



CONCACAF B LICENSE MODULE 1 AND 2

The Concacaf B License is designed to enhance the competencies of coaches who are engaged in coaching in Belize. The course is designed to enhance the coaches' knowledge and skills in coaching techniques, player development, and tactical analysis.

Module one of the course was launched on August 9th, 2022, and saw the participation of 20 coaches from different parts of Belize. The course was led by experienced coach educators who provided valuable insights and training to the participants.

Module two of the course was carried out in October and was facilitated by Coach Educators Neal Ellis from the USA, Rajesh Latchoo from Trinidad & Tobago, and Technical Director for the FFB, Philip Marin. This module continued to build on the concepts and techniques covered in module one and focused on topics such as developing a team's style of play, creating effective training sessions, and improving players' decision-making abilities.

The participation of 17 coaches in module two demonstrates the growing interest in coaching education and development in Belize. The FFB remains committed to providing opportunities for coaches to improve their skills and knowledge through various courses and workshops.



FOOTBALL FEDERATION OF BELIZE D LICENSE

In response to the growing demand for licensed coaches in Belize, the Football Federation of Belize (FFB) has taken significant strides in facilitating the professional development of coaches across the country. Throughout the year, the FFB has organized and conducted various licensing courses in different regions, aimed at building the technical capacity of coaches at different levels.

In March, the FFB launched its D License program, which saw the participation of 30 coaches from across Belize. The course was designed to equip coaches with the necessary skills and knowledge to coach at the youth, amateur and professional levels. The FFB also recognized the need for localized training and, as such, conducted the D License course in Cayo, San Pedro, and Orange Walk in August, October, and November, respectively. Each of these courses saw the participation of 15 coaches from the respective regions.

The FFB's commitment to the professional development of coaches has not only created new opportunities for aspiring coaches but has also helped to raise the quality of coaching across the country. By providing coaches with the tools and resources needed to succeed, the FFB is helping to ensure that the sport of football in Belize continues to grow and thrive.



CONCACAF GENERATION AMAZING



The Generation Amazing Foundation (GAF) represents the pinnacle of human and social legacy programs associated with the FIFA World Cup Qatar 2022 and Concacaf. It seeks to empower Concacaf Member Associations by equipping them with the tools and resources needed to refine their grassroots coach education curriculums. This, in turn, enables local coaches to develop the necessary skills required to deliver entertaining, secure and stimulating football sessions for youths within their communities, thereby promoting the growth of football at the grassroots level.

It is with great pride that we announce the successful soft launch of Generation Amazing. On October 25, a cohort of 25 coach educators participated in this initiative, heralding the beginning of a new chapter in the promotion of football at the grassroots level. This marks a significant milestone in our journey towards a more inclusive, equitable, and sustainable future for football, in which every aspiring coach can access the education and training they require to succeed.

The program has been designed to cater to the holistic development of children through football and offers a unique avenue to enrich their cognitive, social, and physical capabilities. This program provides ample opportunities for children to hone their football skills, enhance their teamwork and leadership abilities, and develop a strong sense of discipline and sportsmanship. A football festival was held on August 17th, 2022, where over 100 children from different regions of Belize enthusiastically participated. REFEREE ASSISTANT PROGRAM



On November 8th, 2022, the Football Federation of Belize completed its Referee Assistance Program with the participation of 13 Referees and 12 Assistant Referees from across the country of Belize.

Instructors for this course were FIFA Technical refereeing instructor Victor Stewart (JAM), FIFA Fitness instructor Kelesha Antoine (ANT) and FIFA/Concacaf Technical refereeing instructor – RDO – John Pitti (PAN). Assisting them during the course was also our Referee's Director Eugene Contreras and FFB Referee Instructors David Henry Jones and Abner Alvarez.

While the course is aimed at updating Referees on the Laws of the Game, improving their interpretation of the Laws of the game for better officiating and Improve in their daily physical training activities, a crucial component of the course is also the fitness test.

The Football Federation of Belize and the Referee Department takes this opportunity to highlight and congratulate the 10 participants were able to pass the fitness test conducted on Saturday October 28th, 2022 at the FFB Stadium in Belmopan.

The Football Federation of Belize takes this opportunity to give recognition to our Referees and Match officials that play a very important role in this game we all love. We express our commitment to continue investing in the development of our Referees and Match Officials to continue improving all facets of the sport.



COMMERCIAL AND MARKETING ACTIVITIES

The Football Federation of Belize (FFB) has achieved significant milestones in its marketing and communications initiatives in 2022. One of the major accomplishments of the year was the production of a professional video of the President's end-of-year remarks. This was done in-house and did not incur any additional expenses for the FFB. Additionally, the federation planned and executed a referee award ceremony, which was live-streamed at no cost to the FFB.

The FFB Marketing and Communication department initiated negotiations for sponsorship deals, including an agreement with TNC for sponsorship inclusive of internet and cable. The federation also partnered with BTB for the Travel Belize Beach Soccer Cup, securing a 15 thousand dollars sponsorship as well as sponsorship from BTB to FFB for the UNCAF 19 Men's Tournament earlier in the year.

The Marketing and Communication department successfully negotiated a no-cost streaming deal for the U13 Elite Male Championships on TNC as well as the finals for all FFB tournaments in 2022.

Other major events of the year which were planned and coordinated by the Marketing Director and the Finance director were the visit of the FIFA President in September 2022 and the football for schools launch. Both these events were featured widely by local media in Belize as well as internationally by FIFA.

During the year the FFB planned and coordinated a student-athlete ceremony and secured plane tickets through private donors. Another sponsorship in 2022 included the 18 thousand-dollar sponsorship deal with NBB for the National Amateur Inter-District Tournament which was then renamed to the National Bank of Belize Amateur Interdistrict competition.

The FFB's media officer traveled with the Women's A team, coordinating all press conferences and promotions for the senior female A team. Other press conference were also planned and coordinated throughout the year.

Furthermore, the FFB Marketing and communications director made efforts to coordinate Olympic day activities, and negotiate a sponsorship deal with the Belize Tourism Board for possible partnerships with BTB for the senior men's team which will amount to a dollar value of over three hundred thousand dollars (pending signing of MOU).

Negotiations were done with Channel Five for CNL broadcasting, securing a \$10K sponsorship deal plus \$2K in marketing support.

The FFB also played a vital role in CONCACAF U17 Female Championships in DR, with the appointment of its media officer, Ms. Yashmin Juan. The UNCAF U19 tournament was live-streamed and the marketing and communications department confirmed sponsorship from BTB and Bowen and Bowen for a total value of over 18 thousand dollars.

Finally, the department created the FFB's annual activity report in January and continued to promote FFB activities and national teams through media coverage and morning shows throughout the year. The efforts of the marketing and communications department have resulted in increased exposure for the FFB and its various initiatives.



FOOTBALL FEDERATION OF BELIZE UNVEILS STRIKING NEW LOGO FOR BELIZE NATIONAL FOOTBALL TEAM

2023 saw the unveiling of the new logo for the Football Federation of Belize. The logo created by Rolando Ramirez embodies the true representation of the Belize Jaguars, Belize's National Football Teams. The new design showcases the country's national unity and spirit of Belizean football.

The centerpiece of the logo is a stylized jaguar, surrounded by an arched wreath with 11 leaves. The 11 leaves symbolize the 11 players on the field. The stars at the bottom of the logo depicts the six districts of Belize, representing the inclusiveness of players from across the entire country as noted in the Map of Belize placed inside the letter "B".

The colors of the logo are a particularly noteworthy aspect of the design, as they are a direct reflection of the colors of the flag of Belize. The Football Federation of Belize has taken great care to ensure that the emblem is closely tied to the country's national identity, and the colors used in the logo are a testament to that effort.

The Jaguar's tongue was strategically designed as a "W." This design represents the spirit and drive to 'W'IN and the representation our 'W'OMEN Jaguars. The FFB has been making great strides for the inclusiveness of Women in football in all areas of the sport.

The new logo will provide a much-needed update to the team, which has used the same emblem since 2013. The organization hopes that the striking new design will inspire players and fans, and help to foster a sense of pride and unity among supporters of Belizean football. ATHLETE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

In 2022, the Football Federation of Belize (FFB) initiated a pioneering project aimed at procuring athletic scholarships for gifted student-athletes who participate in our national team program. This ambitious endeavor sought to endow these athletes with a distinctive opportunity to pursue their athletic and scholarly aspirations at some of the most renowned universities in the United States.

Thanks to the FFB's vigorous exertions, a total of 22 scholarships were secured, with 10 allocated to female athletes and 12 to their male counterparts. This constitutes a notable accomplishment, with the aggregate value of these scholarships exceeding 1.2 million dollars. This outlay in the advancement of our youth athletes exemplifies the FFB's unwavering pledge to cultivate excellence in both sports and academics.

The FFB acknowledges that procuring athletic scholarships is a crucial constituent of honing our young talent and empowering them to attain their full potential. By providing these opportunities, we aspire to invigorate and galvanize our student-athletes to persistently pursue their passions and strive for excellence in all facets of their lives.

Looking ahead, the FFB intends to persist with this program over the subsequent four-year cycle, with the goal of acquiring an even greater number of scholarships for our young athletes. We steadfastly believe that initiatives like this will have a direct and affirmative influence not solely on our national team program, but on the entire nation, facilitating the creation of a brighter future for the subsequent generation of Belizean athletes and leaders.

The event was attended by government officials and football stakeholders and provided an excellent opportunity for fostering stronger relationships while showcasing the rich Belizean culture and cuisine. FFB was thrilled to host the FIFA President, and the visit was an absolute success, leaving an indelible impression on everyone who was fortunate enough to be in attendance.
